



# First Nations Child and Family Services and Jordan's Principle Settlement

Valid Government-Issued Identification



To apply for compensation, all Claimants will be required to provide a valid piece of government-issued identification (ID).

Valid ID may include



Photo



Legal Name



Signature



Date of Birth



Expiry Date

## How to obtain valid government-issued identification:



### Visit the issuing authority:

- Go to a local government service centre in your province/territory or a Service Canada office
- Check the relevant website for:
  - Office locations and hours of operation
  - Whether you need to book an appointment
- Visit the Service Canada website, to find an office near you



### Gather required documents:

- Common documents may include:
  - Proof of identity: e.g., birth certificate, passport
  - Proof of residency: e.g., utility bill, rental agreement
  - Other specific documents required by your province/territory
- Depending on your province/territory of residence, additional requirements may include:
  - That you be at least the Age of Majority to apply without a co-signer or parent
  - A guarantor if you lack the necessary supporting documentation



### Complete application forms and provide documentation:

- Fill out the application forms provided by the issuing authority
  - These forms will ask for personal information that supports your identity such as:
    - ◊ Full legal name
    - ◊ Date of birth
    - ◊ Current address
    - ◊ Any other relevant details
- Submit with your application:
  - All required documentation
  - A photo, if required (either submitted with the application or taken at the office)



### Wait for processing:

- Your application will be reviewed by the issuing government
  - Processing may take a few weeks or longer in some regions
- Once approved:
  - You may receive your ID by mail
  - Or request to pick it up in person
  - Some forms of ID may require a signature upon delivery or pickup



### Pay the fees:

- There may be fees to apply for documentation:
  - Fees vary by ID type and by province/territory



**Important Note:** Processes and requirements can vary by province or territory. It is important to visit your provincial/territorial government's website or contact the relevant department for accurate and up-to-date information.
