### **Session Description:**

This session will also provide an opportunity to participate in a facilitated discussion to discuss the challenges and opportunities presented by the Act, provide feedback to help inform the AFN's ongoing work with respect to the Act, and provide suggestions for additional ways in which the AFN can support First Nations pursuing the pathway to exercising jurisdiction for child and family services.
