#### **Veterans Council**

In April 2023, Veteran Percy Joe signed a Letter of Understanding (LOU) with Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) and the Minister of Veterans Affairs and Associate Minister of National Defense, Honourable Lawrence MacAulay. The look ahead for the Veterans Council is optimistic, with many opportunities to collaborate with VAC. The Veterans Council anticipates a lot of movement around priorities, such as:

- Maintaining outreach programs for First Nations Veterans and their families
- Establishing clear points of contact for First Nations Veterans
- Ensuring culturally appropriate representation in commemoration ceremonies
- Prioritizing and improving historical record keeping

These initiatives are part of the mandate outlined in Resolution 02/2020 AFN First Nations Veterans Council.
