RELATIONSHIP DEVELOPMENT

School service

A school service centre is a public legal entity governed by a board of directors. Its mission is to support and assist public school establishments in a given geographical area by providing administrative services, in order to foster education for its population.

SEFPN

Called N8wkika (pronounced Naonwkéka), meaning “to sow for the long term”.
The primary mission of social services is to create a more stable, dynamic, and safe family and social environment for the children of the Wôlinak and Odanak communities.
Voluntary-based service.

RELATIONSHIP DEVELOPMENT

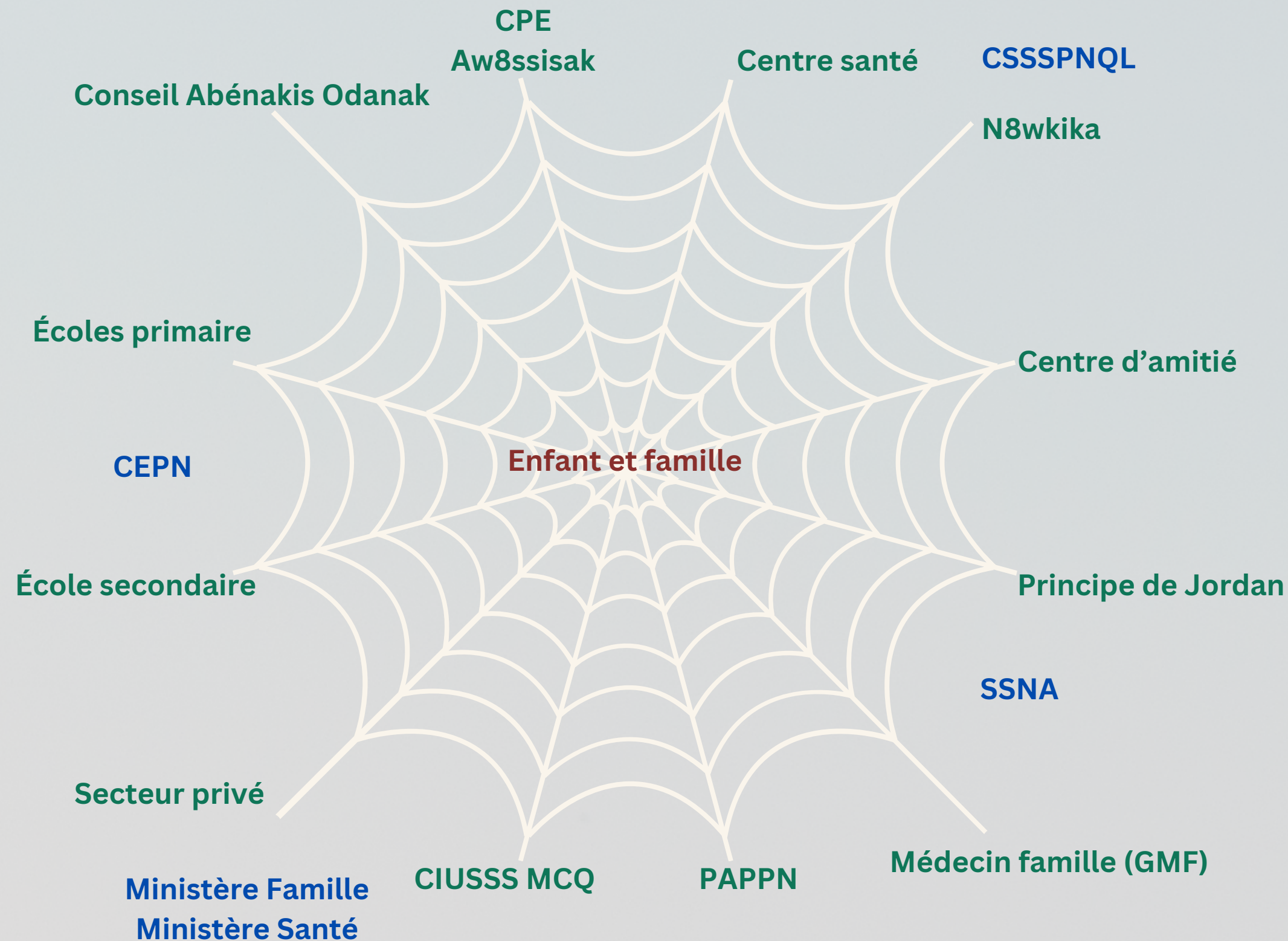
Early Childhood Centre (CPE)

- Language stimulation service recommended by a speech therapist, through a pedagogical officer funded by Jordan's Principle.
- Coordinator's presence in activities including parents and children.

Public and private clinics

- CIUSSS MCQ (Integrated University Health and Social Services Centre of Mauricie and Centre-du-Québec)
- Responsible for ensuring integration of care and services offered to the population of its territorial network.
 - Ensures the organization and complementarity of services within its different missions (hospital, CLSC, long-term care, youth protection, rehabilitation centres, public health), according to the needs and territorial realities of its population.
