






Mino Bimaadizidaa

Aaniish Naa


Community Members can access services through Assigns from our Partners or a self-referral themselves.

December 1, 1965

The 1965 Indian Welfare Agreement is a cost-sharing arrangement between the Province of Ontario and the Minister of Indian and Northern Affairs (INAC). Under this agreement, INAC was obligated to reimburse Ontario for certain expenses related to the welfare services provided to Indigenous people in the province.

- First Nations were not a signatory to this agreement.
- The 1965 Indian Welfare Agreement remains in force.






